RBC DAIN RAUSCHER DONATES \$25,000 TO THE CHILDREN'S CENTER

SALT LAKE CITY – May 14, 2007 – RBC Dain Rauscher – a division of the Royal Bank of Canada in the United States that provides financial services for investors – has donated \$25,000 to The Children's Center.

The Children's Center is a SLC-based charitable organization that provides comprehensive mental health care to infants, toddlers, preschoolers and their families. The donation is earmarked for The Parent Resource Center in The Children's Center's future home at the Oquirrh School, 350 South 400 East in downtown Salt Lake City.

Increasing demand for The Children Center's services prompted its board and staff to launch a \$10 million capital campaign to fund the purchase and renovation of the Oquirrh School in 2006. The new location will more than double the capacity for clinical services and therapeutic preschool classrooms.

The Children's Center's Executive Director, Dr. Douglas Goldsmith, praised the generosity of RBC Dain Rauscher.

"The Children's Center relies on the steadfast friendship of its community partners," Goldsmith said. "We are grateful to RBC Dain Rauscher for reaching out to help parents of little kids with big problems gain access to

information and resources as they struggle to understand and help their children."

Salt Lake City Branch Director of RBC Dain Rauscher John F. Hinman said his organization chose The Children's Center to help assure that as many children as possible have the opportunity to live safe, happy and healthy childhoods.

"Our children are our future," said Hinman. "That future is brighter for everyone if we offer hope to our children and their families who need it most. That's why The Children's Center is one of our choices. We want to help deliver that hope to children in need within the Salt Lake community."

The Children's Center is a 45-year-old private non-profit dedicated to providing mental health care to young children and their families. Renovation of the Oquirrh School is scheduled to begin early in 2008 and the Center plans to move from its current location across from the University Hospital in January of 2009. The Center's second location will continue to be in Kearns.
